SBC's **Senior High Knowledge Bowl** (SHKB) is a season of interdisciplinary academic competitions for students in **grades 9-12**. Teams of students compete in written and oral rounds by answering questions related to all areas of learning typical of secondary educational programs.

Teams work cooperatively developing teamwork and joint decision making skills as students acquire knowledge and critical thinking skills in many areas. All teams participate in three regular season meets. Qualifying teams advance to post season play in the form of Subregionals, Regionals and a State Meet.

Participating metro teams span from Hastings to Waconia, St. Francis to Prior Lake. Meets take place in the evening at high schools peppered around the Twin Cities (Prior Lake, Academy of Holy Angels, Andover High School, South St. Paul, and more)— it's an excellent opportunity to meet students all over the Metro and test your smarts and chops.

Across the state, over 800 high school teams from 278 districts and over 500 middle school teams from 221 districts statewide play KB. Be a part of some excellent academic competition!
